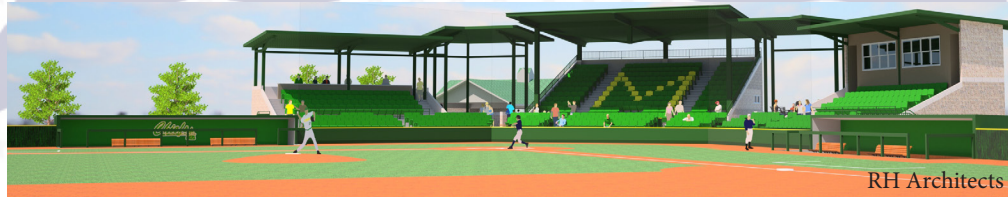

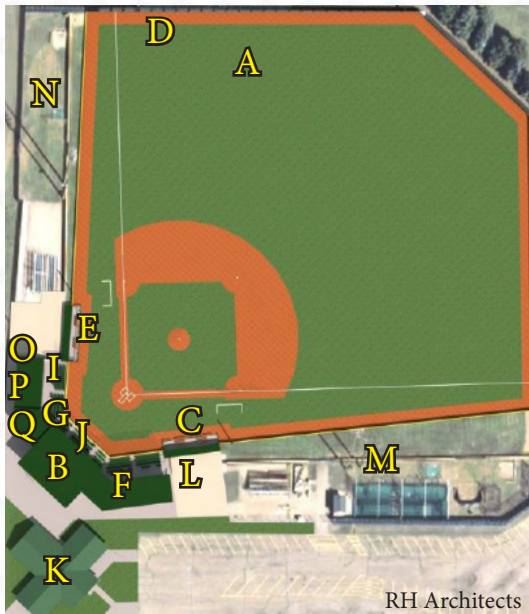

PROJECT HISTORY

Mandan Baseball Club, Inc. (Club) was formed in the early 1990s by a group of motivated parents and supporters of Mandan baseball to fund and manage all aspects of American Legion Baseball through Mandan's Gilbert S. Furness American Legion Post #40, specifically the Chiefs (varsity) and A's (junior varsity). Recently, the Club expanded its operations to include funding and managing its Babe Ruth teams (Veterans), girls fastpitch softball, and the first 7th and 8th grade school baseball program in western North Dakota (78s). Additionally, the Club provides monetary assistance to the Cal Ripken baseball program (9-12 year olds and Mavericks all star teams) and youth baseball (5-8 year olds).

Striving to provide Mandan youth with athletic success and the opportunity to learn valuable life lessons and virtues through baseball, the Club partnered with the Mandan Parks District and a delegation of Mandan's esteemed American War Veterans that were hand-picked by Mandan's Veterans Of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 707 and American Legion Post 40 to pursue the much-needed renovation of Mandan's Veterans Memorial Ballpark. Considering the dugouts, press box, and grandstand wings haven't been improved since the 1980s, this renovation project is much-needed and will bolster Mandan's claim to one of the best places to live in all of America.

Despite the prominence of big business and corporate takeover in America, the Club and Parks District have vowed to continue identifying the stadium as "Veterans Memorial Ballpark." Our veterans have earned this honor and their contributions to our freedoms must be recognized. The only way to ensure that Veterans Memorial Ballpark remains dedicated to our veterans, however, is with your generous contributions to this project.
