Mandan Park District Board Meeting Minutes August 8, 2022

The Board of Park Commissioners duly met in special session on Monday, August 8, 2022, at City Hall, 205 2nd Ave NW in the Bosch Froelich room.

Attendees:

Park Commissioners: President Wade Meschke, Vice President Miles Mehlhoff, Jen Froehlich, Stan Scott and Lavn Mudder

Park District Staff present: Cole Higlin, Teri Welch, Dustin Fleck, and Dave Frueh.

Vice President Mehlhoff called the meeting to order at approximately 5:30pm, CDT.

Public Communication: No one appeared.

<u>Minutes</u>: Motion by Commissioner Mehlhoff and seconded by Commissioner Scott to approve the July 11, 2022 regular meeting and July 18, 2022 special meeting. Motion passes 5-0.

<u>Item #1</u> Director Higlin provided updates on the following projects:

- a. Dale Pahlke Arena at Dakota Community Bank & Trust rodeo grounds has fundraised YTD \$3 million and we have three donors pending which equates to an additional \$300,000. The loan with Dakota Community Bank & Trust has been executed in the amount of \$2 million @ 3.01% over seven years. President Meschke and I signed loan documents on August 5, 2022. The facility is slightly behind schedule waiting on bleachers and aluminum tin for the grandstand. Most of the work being completed so far is underground utilities, drainage for the arena, and welding of the grandstands.
- b. The Mandan Tennis Center project has the footings poured about 70% and walls 40% of the dome area. The welcome building footings are completed. The project is 30 days behind schedule due to delivery of materials and contractors hope they can make up time on other parts of the project. The lease with Mandan Tennis LLC has been signed and the \$4.1 million dollar loan @ 3.22% for 20yr term was executed on August 5, 2022, with President Meschke and I signing the paperwork. The lease payments will start January 1, 2023. Director Higlin stated that the tour of the site will take place immediately following the board meeting.
- c. Director Higlin updated the board that the ARPA grant that we approved in April 2022 in the amount of \$541,750 with a local dollar for dollar match will start the week of August 22, 2022. We will use \$300,000 from RR fund and \$241,750 from the Capital Improvement fund which was also approved at the board meeting in April. The interior renovations will take place in November once bids are approved at the October board meeting.
- d. Steve Burian, Burian & Associates updated the board that phase 1 has been completed and operating efficiently. Since the board decided to hold off on phase 2 due to increased construction costs, we will have to incur costs from Fetzer Electric to install electrical outlets for the sump pump and light switch for staff. The Corp of Engineers also lost funding in 2022 to review our application for permitting water from the Heart River. The new budget cycle for the Federal Government is Oct. 1, 2022, and at that time will assess the funding and determine if we can proceed with the permitting process. Currently we only have 4 of the 11 Corp of Engineers that provided comment on the permitting process. Once we receive all recommendations for changes, we will present their requests and determine how to proceed.

<u>Item #2:</u> Recreation and Facilities Manager Dave Frueh presented approval for the Legendary Beverage Contract at the Starion Sports Complex. Legendary Beverage only sells alcohol at U of Mary hockey games. Motion by Commissioner Mehlhoff and seconded by Commissioner Froehlich to approve a 5 yr. contract with Legendary Beverage for 2022-2025 season. Motion passes 5-0.

Special Assessments Fund – Increase due to new specials being assessed on Park District property – largest begin the new 16th Street & Parking Lot by the Sports Complex and new Tennis Center.

G.O. Bond Fund – new fund for paying existing district-wide specials refinanced in 2021.

Cap Impr Fund – Budgeting to use \$80,000 in fund reserves to cover the cost of baseball fencing.

Raging Rivers Fund – Budgeting to use \$75,000 in fund reserves, if necessary, since the debt payment has been increased by this amount with last year's refinance of the facility payment.

2023 Budget highlights:

- Two new positions:
 - Golf
 - Parks/SSC shared
 - Cost Of Living Adjustment (COLA) 3% January 1
 - Merit 2% on employee anniversary date
 - ND Public Health Insurance Trust –awaiting premium pricing for 2023, budgeted 5% increase
 - Current budget year of the total tax levy for Mandan of 285.16 mills, the Park District accounted for 10% or 28.29 mills.
 - For 2023, we are budgeting an overall increase in mills by .92, for a total of 29.21 mills.
 - Decrease in General Fund Mills by .71
 - Increase in Special Assessments Fund Mills by .59
 - o Increase in G.O. Bond Fund Mills by .94 (New fund and separate levy required by bond for refinanced special assessments)
 - For 2023, the estimated mill value is \$115,307, bringing our total dollars levied to \$3,367,729.
 - Cost to taxpayer (based on average \$275,000 home)
 - \$11/year increase if their property value was unchanged.
 - \$44/year increase if their property value increased by 9%.
