Mandan Park District Board Meeting Minutes October 9, 2023

The Board of Park Commissioners duly met on Monday, October 9, 2023, at City Hall, 205 2nd Ave NW in the Bosch Froelich room.

Attendees:

Park Commissioners: President Wade Meschke, Vice President Miles Mehlhoff, Commissioners Stan Scott, Jen Froehlich, and Layn Mudder.

Park District Staff present: Cole Higlin and Dustin Fleck

President Meschke called the meeting to order at approximately 5:30pm, CDT.

<u>Public Communication:</u> No one appeared.

<u>Minutes</u>: Motion by Commissioner Mudder and seconded by Commissioner Froehlich to approve the September 11, 2023, regular meeting and September 22, 2023 special meeting minutes. Motion passes 5-0.

<u>Item #1</u>: Director Higlin and Jesse Kist from AE2S presented a power point on the proposed boat ramp. The highlights of the power point discuss the need for security lighting, proper signage for boaters, parking for 47 truck/trailers, 7 parking stalls for standard vehicles, and a ramp that will service two boats at the same time with a dock in the middle. Alternates for the project will include kayak launch, fish cleaning station, vault toilet, pedestrian bridge connecting the two properties for overflow parking, and picnic shelter/benches. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$1.6 million, and we have \$300,000 in contingency and if these funds are not needed during construction, we will dedicate them to the alternatives based on comments tonight. President Meschke opened the public hearing for comments.

Paige Peterson lives in Eastwood Acres and has concerns about the traffic and especially the intersection near Culvers that already is difficult with all the activity currently there with the daycare and now the newly constructed building.

Virgil Horst opposes the boat ramp and concerns are traffic, current of the river, concerns with railroad derailment, two pontoons passing one another on a tight road and the tight corner once you go under the interstate, and rip rap needs in the area.

Gary McSweyn does not support the boat ramp and would like facilities to shut down after hours.

Rollie Messmer opposed the boat ramp because of narrow road, additional traffic for kids' safety, narrow channel and the site whirlpools, wakes from boats impact erosion.

Steve Hulm opposes the boat ramp and would like the parking lots paved. When it rains mud is drug onto the road from the archery range and the proposed boat ramp area.

Madonna Gunther wants the area protected for walkers.

John Schultz opposes the boat ramp due to curve in the road, not paved parking lot, no bridge, we need to consider a different site, and the park district should stop building.

Franklyn Novotny concerns are garbage and noise related issues.

Mathias Erhardt opposes the boat ramp and has seen a 28% increase in park district taxes. Concerns are the noxious weeds and lack of mowing that takes place today in that area.

Mary Kay Tokach wants the area preserved for walker, bird watchers, and doesn't support motorized use in the area.

Jeff Herman, a Bismarck resident supports the ramp and requested information on the length of the boat ramp and elevations of the site.

Don McGuire wanted other sites to be considered and stated that there are environmental impacts to the area and states that there is a burial site on the property.

President Meschke closed the public hearing and asked Director Higlin and Jesse Kist from AE2S to respond to some of the comments that were presented. Director Higlin stated that the reason this site is favored is that we don't have to purchase land. The Park District and the City met with a couple of landowners with property for sale adjacent to the Missouri River and the land price was prohibitive. Jesse Kist from AE2S addresses most of the citizens' questions.

President Meschke thanked everyone for attending and please reach out to Director Higlin for further information related to the boat ramp.

<u>Item # 2:</u> Andrew Stromme presented the final draft of the Placemaking Grant for the existing high school site. The plan illustrated potential road expansions along with parking garage and connectivity to the All Seasons Arena with the southern portion of the site is a mix of commercial and residential spaces.

<u>Item # 3:</u> Director Higlin presented the revised investment plan for the Park District. The policy was tabled in September as Commissioner Mudder wanted language to be added that the Accounting Manager will provide monthly reports of investments along with rates and terms. Director Higlin stated that we also added approved designated depositories that we are required every even year for the Park Commissioners to approve. If staff wanted to invest with a banking institution not listed on our designated depository, they would be required to present them to the board for approval.

<u>Commissioner/Staff reports:</u> Commissioners wanted to share their condolences to the family for the loss of life of Max Schaf that happened at the skate park. Commissioner Mudder shared that the RC Track is close to completion and looks forward to seeing it being used next year.

Motion by Commissioner Froehlich and seconded by Commissioner Scott to approve monthly bills as presented. Motion passes 5-0.
